Dear Friends —

2025 marked a transformative year for our scholarship program. In April, we received a historic \$13 million gift from the former Becker College. This funding will establish a \$10 million Becker Scholarship Fund, awarding significant multi-year scholarships to high school students in Worcester and Leicester, as well as the new Becker Global Public Service Award. Awards from the Becker Scholarship Program will begin in 2026, notably increasing our annual scholarship distribution support for students.

This remarkable gift builds on the strength and momentum of our scholarship program today. In 2025, we were proud to support 234 students with new scholarships through the Foundation, each representing a unique path, a bold ambition, and a community that believes in their potential. Thanks to our community of 142 scholarship fundholders, we committed \$1.84 million in scholarship aid this year, our largest investment to date.

This total includes:

- **138 new one-time awards**
- **96 new renewable scholarships**
- **209 renewable commitments continuing from prior years**

Sixty-seven percent of new awardees (151 students) are pursuing their education at colleges in Massachusetts. Of those, 53 are staying close to home and attending schools in Worcester County.

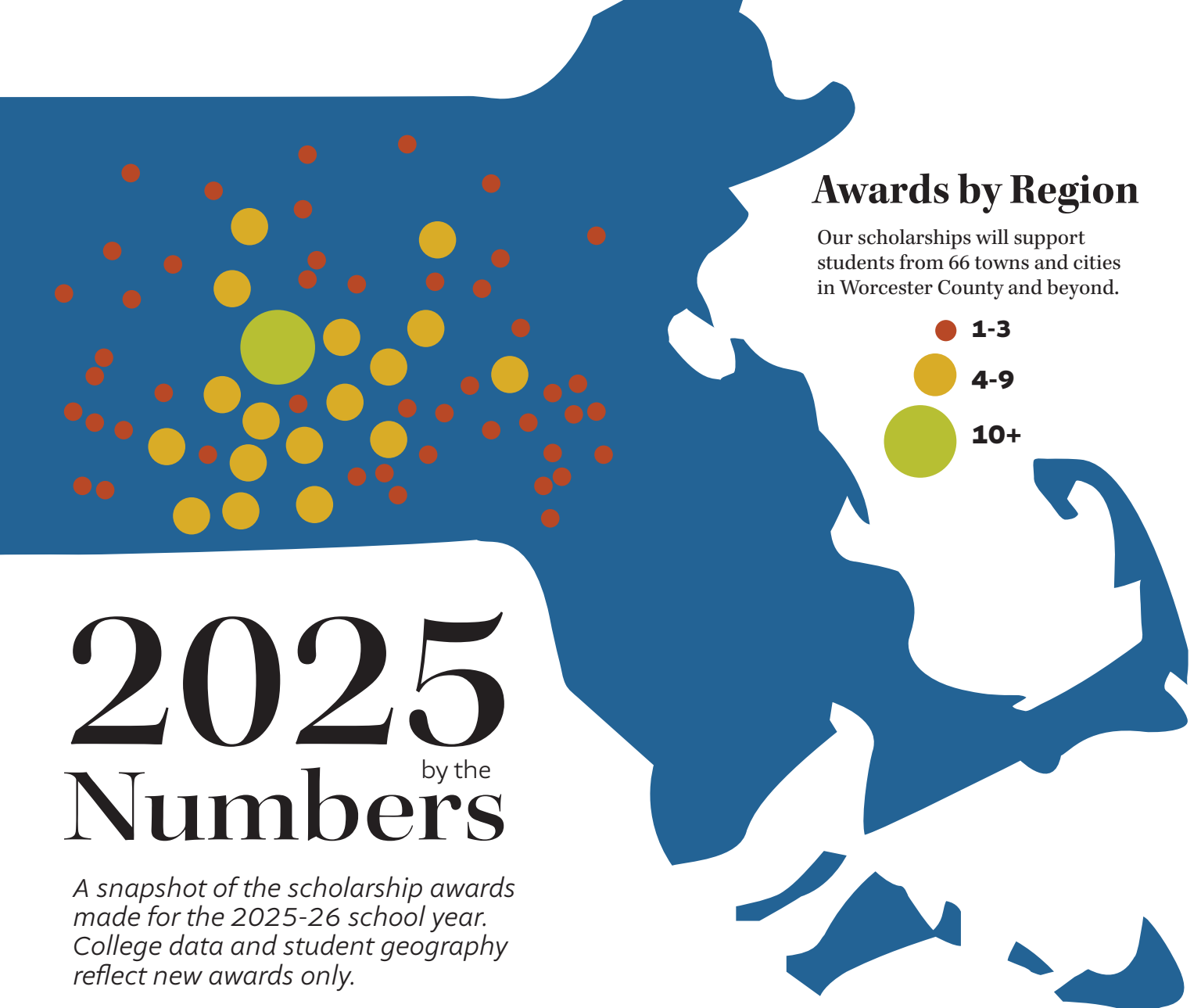

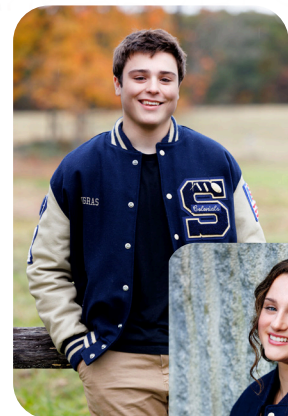

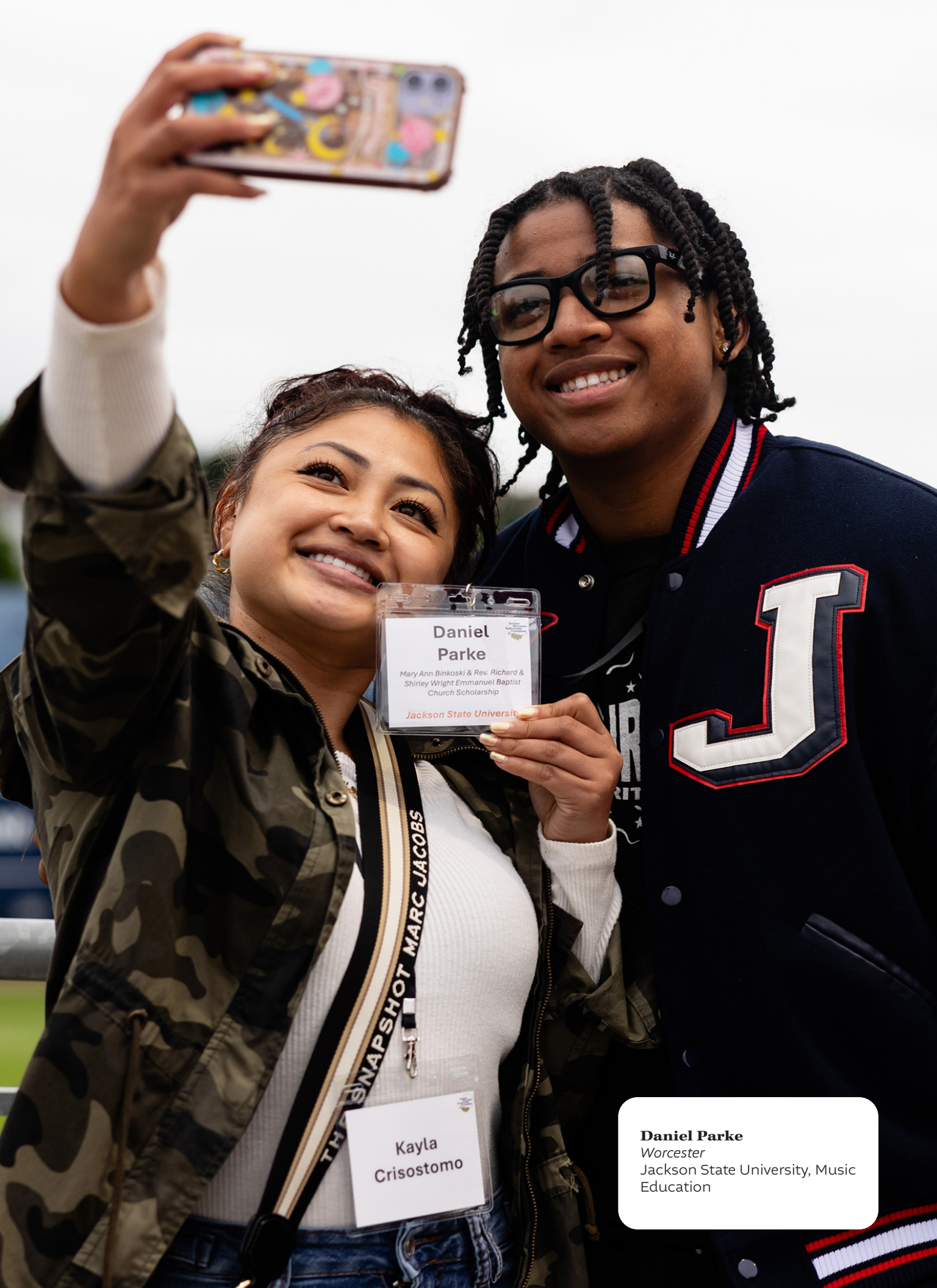

2025 Scholarship Highlights

A TRANSFORMATIVE GIFT FROM BECKER COLLEGE

This year, Greater Worcester Community Foundation received a historic \$13 million gift from the former Becker College to create the Becker Scholarship Program, including more than \$10 million for the Becker Scholarship Fund, as well as the transfer of the Grace S. Hampel Scholarship Fund.

It also includes a new \$2 million Becker Global Public Service Award, which will provide a monetary award to support a humanitarian project anywhere in the world, developed and led by a Worcester County rising college senior or graduate. These opportunities will begin to be available and awarded in 2026.

THE POWER OF RENEWABLE SCHOLARSHIPS

We continue to see the benefits of renewable scholarships that provide financial support for students throughout their college journey. The Herbert D. Sherwin Memorial Scholarship, established in 2004, has awarded \$100,000 to 17 students over the years. Designed to help local college students transition from community colleges to complete their bachelor's degrees, this fund has been transformational for students like Pauline Farinacci, who is receiving her final \$9,500 award this year.

This scholarship helped Pauline attend Mount Wachusett Community College and then transfer to Fitchburg State University, where she is completing a degree in film at no out-of-pocket cost. This consistent support allowed her to live on campus, fully engage in her creative work, and grow personally and professionally without the burden of debt.
